This year we have two missions projects to involve individuals, families, Sunday School classes, other church groups and Christian Schools:

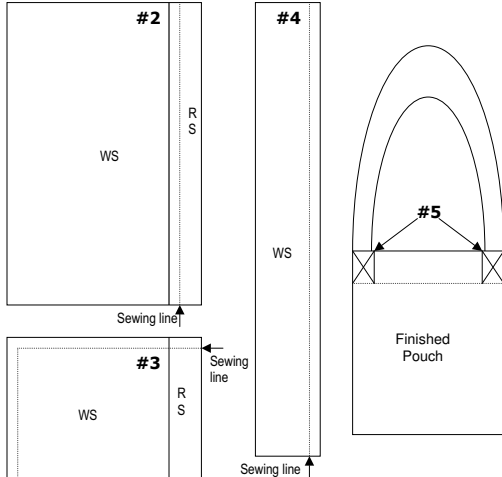
SEWING PROJECT

POUCHES FOR GALCOM INTERNATIONAL



The pouches are used by the Quechua people of Bolivia. The Quechua carry their radio in this pouch. The radios are the most effective tool for discipleship in the Quechua villages.

A common testimony from many hearers of the radio is that in places where there are no churches or where one would have to walk many miles to find another Christian family, the radio is their Pastor and Teacher. It goes with them wherever they go... Praise God for these "little red missionaries that stay behind to proclaim God's love after we leave."



POUCH INSTRUCTIONS

1. Using sturdy material cut out the pouch 7½" x 12" and the strap 3" x 30".
2. Fold one long side of pouch by ¼" and then ¼" to form hem. Sew along edge of hem.
3. Fold pouch in half with the right sides (RS) together. Sew 3/8" seam around the remaining raw edges on the wrong side (WS) to create the pocket.
4. Fold strap in half lengthwise and sew 3/8" seam. Turn right side out and flatten.
5. Sew strap securely in an X pattern to the top folded edge on opposite corners.
6. Turn the pouch right side out when finished.
